ANAPHYLAXIS At St. Margaret Mary

St. Margaret Mary Catholic Elementary School is a place where all children feel safe and have a sense of belonging. To ensure the safety and well-being of all children, please note below important information from Anaphylaxis Canada:

Anaphylaxis is a serious allergic reaction that is rapid in onset and may cause death;
Signs and symptoms of a severe allergic reaction can occur within minutes of exposure to an allergen
(a substance capable of causing an allergic reaction)

Very small amounts of certain foods can cause severe reactions when eaten. This may happen if a person at risk touches an allergenic substance and then subsequently touches the mouth. Even a very small amount 'hidden' in a food or transferred to a serving utensil has the potential to cause a severe allergic reaction. Direct ingestion of an allergy-causing food poses the greatest risk for people with food allergies.

Cooperation from parent and guardians in adhering to the guidelines below is most appreciated:

There are students at this school who are allergic to the following foods and items: Nut Products , peanuts (ingested), Tree Nuts (ingested)
: Egg Products
: Shrimp (ingested)
: Sunflowers

Parents will be advised of allergens specific to a classroom; please avoid bringing these allergens into the designated classroom.

Reinforce hand washing practices: wash hands before and after eating.

Remind children not to share or trade food, food utensils, or food containers.

Please do NOT bring any home-made food products into the school; with permission, non-food items are permitted for various celebrations and special events and activities.

Thank you for your help in keeping all our children safe.

TASR CONFLICT RESOLUTION

Our school continues a School –wide initiative to support conflict resolution for all students in all grades. TASR stands for:
T HINK before you act and recognize consequences
A SK people to STOP and seek answers to understand them
S TATE YOUR FEELINGS so they stop. Apologize if necessary
R ESOLVE THE CONFLICT so all agree
You may still need Staff help

Our students have a Conflict Resolution model that can help them today and throughout their school years.

EMERGENCY DRILLS

We conduct three kinds of Emergency Drills at our school: Bomb Threat, Fire Drills, Lockdowns. Students are trained and practice how to respond to a Fire by attending to bells and safely exiting the building. Bomb Threats result in an immediate evacuation. Lockdowns can be of varying degrees;
Lockdown secures the building. No entry. Staff and Students in safe places.
Hold and Secure: No entry. School continues
Shelter In Place: No exit until safe (ex. weather)
We train so we are ready for emergencies.
Ask your child how they have already prepared for these.

Progress Reports and Parent/Guardian Interviews (Thursday November 16, 2017 3- 8 p.m.)

Parents/Guardian will be receiving Progress reports from classroom teachers on Tuesday November, 14, 2017. Interviews will be scheduled by the teachers as per times provided by the families. We do our best to accommodate requests and support that many of these interviews will take place at other dates and times that work for families and staff. This is the first report on progress for the year. Contact your child's teacher to set alternative arrangements. Celebrate strengths and support some next steps to help students do their best.



We appreciate that students like to play with toys and gaming cards for fun. They can be instructional and can teach co-operation and fair trade. **However, too often these toys (ex. Fidget Spinners, Pokemon Cards, etc.) are becoming distractions in class and leading to fights and even stealing!** To this end we are encouraging Parents/Guardians to NOT allow these toys to come to school. Classes have games available for free time in class. Lost or stolen toys are not the responsibility of the school. (similar to our Handheld Device Policy). We encourage students to find other activities at school for fun. Thank you for your support.
